
All Worship Services and Gatherings are held at Northampton Unitarians Meeting House, St. Katherine's Terrace, Northampton NN1 2AX.

Our new Community Development Coordinator introduces herself

The first time I came to Northampton Unitarians was for the Grand Opening of the new Meeting House on 7th May 2016 and I remember the warm welcome and the ripples of excitement at the opportunity of having a new home in the town centre.



"Brilliant words by a previous minister of Northampton Unitarians with the hymn, *All Are Welcome Here*! What a truly welcoming message for the wider community! Very, very happy to be here." (a post I made on my Facebook profile the first time I visited on 7th May 2016).

Almost three years to the day later, I moved to Northamptonshire (a move I'd been planning a while!). In the intervening time I'd visited the congregation to lead worship, and learned how much this welcoming atmosphere wasn't just for 'special days' like the Opening. It was part of the fabric of this community just as Peter Galbraith wrote.

Sharing this version of the 'good news' with the wider community within Northampton and beyond to other areas of the county is what I hope to be able to help the congregation achieve going forward. We have always maintained links with other local churches and faith groups as well as connecting with the wider local and national Unitarian bodies supporting our movement.

Community Development is defined on Wikipedia thus:

The United Nations defines community development as "a process where community members come together to take collective action and generate solutions to common problems." It is a broad concept, applied to the practices of civic leaders, activists, involved citizens, and professionals to improve various aspects of communities, typically aiming to build stronger and more resilient local communities.

Churches have for a long time had a key role in assisting building strong and resilient communities. Looking back into our heritage and history, we can see evidence of the times when this community has been part of this; the roll of honour displayed on the wall of the Meeting House from the First World War, and the

framed subscription to the United Nations Peace Declaration being just two examples of our collective action and our responses to events.

Collective action can only grow out of connection and conversations. One of my hopes as I begin to explore our potential to engage with new people and groups is to have opportunities to talk with people, discover their passions, interests, pursuits, find out the challenges they face, see how they want to change the world for the better, and then explore if we can developing relationships where our goals align.

For me the spiritual aspect of our lives is deeply intertwined with our personal and collective experiences, our reactions and actions in the face of the multitude of things that make up our lives is somewhere we can help each other, celebrate, remember, acknowledge, progress and process all that comes to pass.

I would like to invite all of our current and prospective members to seek me out for a one to one conversation. A roughly 45 minute chat where we can mutually share our thoughts and experiences. In this way I can find out what you would like to see happening in our localities, what you're already involved in etc. In learning more about each other we can begin to build these conversations into collective action over time.
